2	Bac	Background, terms of reference and future work			
	The group reviewed draft terms of reference for the taskforce. The <b>GLA</b> will revise these in view of the group's comments and circulate revised version to the group, to be formally agreed.				
	The group identified the following initial issues for the taskforce's future consideration and agreed to set up sub groups, where appropriate, to take this work forward following this meeting:				
	1	data (sub group) – to understanding the data on rough sleeping more effectively and provide reports to the taskforce. This will help underpin a comprehensive approach to rough sleeping interventions. Two specific areas the group agreed to investigate were intermittent rough sleepers and individuals' circumstances immediately before sleeping rough. PD agreed to share LB Lambeth's research on circumstances before sleeping rough.	GLA LB Lambeth		
	2	<b>hostels (sub group)</b> – to look at the effectiveness of hostels and whether this provision could be used more efficiently across London. This workstream may also cover provision for a growing cohort of older rough sleepers, whose needs are not well met by mainstream sheltered accommodation.	GLA HL		
	3	<b>mental health (sub group)</b> – to look at more effective interventions around mental health. The group will identify key issues and asks to consider further. It was agreed that the <b>GLA</b> , <b>DCLG</b> and <b>St Mungo's</b> will work with other partners to identify key issues and asks.	GLA St M's DCLG		
	4	<b>No First Night Out</b> – to review of the effectiveness the pilot with a view to informing future interventions.	LB Tower Hamlets		
	5	<b>supported housing</b> - to develop a response from the taskforce to the supported housing consultation. This will consider issues around Universal Credit, what accommodation is treated in this way, support for move on accommodation, and how to ensure local authorities retain capacity to commission hostels that meet local needs. <b>Homeless Link</b> , <b>Crisis</b> , <b>St Mungo's</b> and <b>TP</b> will produce an initial draft. 3	Options for pan-London services for DCLG's prevention and early intervention fund	
	DO'C confirmed that DCLG hopes to issue a prospectus for the £10m of funding for prevention of and early intervention in rough sleeping that was announced in the budget soon, and that funding will be available to local authorities. She suggested that some of the proposals submitted for the group's consideration may be better suited to a further £10m available for supporting entrenched rough sleepers, via SIBs, or other DCLG funding – e.g., for women with complex needs who have experienced domestic violence. 	It welcomed the <b>HOPE and NFNO</b> proposals.	
	It supported the <b>non-UK nationals</b> proposal, observing that closer coordination could help ensure that single service offers are being made and that those who are vulnerable are referred to Routes Home.	GLA
	DO'C will keep the group updated on other resources that might also benefit this work.	DCLG
	It was agreed that the proposal for <b>additional outreach capacity on public transport</b> should be taken forward subject to establishing further information about those sleeping rough on public transport.	GLA
	The group agreed that proposals relating to <b>female rough sleepers and mental health</b> align more closely with the objectives of DCLG funding for SIBs and should therefore be taken into account in the development of proposals for a new London SIB.	
	The group agreed the proposal on <b>cross-borough accommodation solutions</b> may not fit either funding stream, but that there is scope to better understand who's using hostels, how long they stay and whether people who need this accommodation are unable to access it. <b>PD</b> to circulate details of the existing reciprocal agreement. <b>All</b> to identify issues relating to hostels and relay these to DE, so GLA can assess scope for the taskforce pursuing work on this issue. PD, Westminster and JSw would contribute.	LB Lambeth All
