1. Welcome and apologies

The Chair welcomed members to the meeting including David Warner the new representative of London Funders and noted apologies

2. Minutes of the last meeting and matters arising

- 2.1. Minutes of the last meeting of 14 November 2013 agreed as an accurate record
- 2.2. Matters arising from the last meeting:
- 2.2.1 Page 2 (action 1) Deputy Mayor, Kit Malthouse, wrote to the then immigration Minister asking for justification for the police registration requirement or its removal. A copy of the letter has been circulated. Reply has not been received yet
- 2.2.2 Page 3 (action 2 and 3)- the LSMP working group is reporting back under agenda item 5 Page 4 (action 4) GLA to coordinate input of London stakeholders' into priorities of the Home Office for the next round of EU Migration and Integration Fund

3. Chair's update

- 3.1. The Chair gave a note of thanks to Kit Malthouse, Deputy Mayor for Business and Enterprise for acting as interim chair.
- 3.2. GLA European Integration Fund bid for English language support in schools -

The GLA has secured £1.5m of funding from the European Integration Fund and match funded with £500,000 from the GLA London School Excellence Fund

The project aims to improve the quality of teaching provision for non-EU pupils in primary and secondary schools and to improve the English of non-EU mothers and their involvement in school

- 3.3. 10 projects have been allocated funds. The final signing of the grants is expected before announcing the projects
- 3.4. Members suggested visiting the projects or ask them to present to the LSMP

4. An overview of last year's achievements and priorities for next year

- 4.1 Roudy Shafie, Principal Policy Officer at the GLA gave an overview of the outcomes & key achievements of the LSMP business plan for 2013/14 and the presented the draft objectives for 2014/15
- 4.2 Hong Tan informed members about the research they have commissioned on needs assessment in the removal centres with views that the issues are to be integrated into the Clinical Commissioning Groups work. The Office of CCGs London is supportive
- 4.3 Andrew Lawton gave an update on the Transition Service Statement for newly recognised Refugees. The project is being held back by the lack of engagement and contact person from the newly restructured UKVI asylum team.
- 4.4 Members comments were an ongoing need for better media representation of refugees and migrants, as well as coordination of English language providers across London.

5. LSMP project to improve compliance on preventing illegal working

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- 5.1. Roudy Shafie summarised the GLA support to the Home Office on this agenda by hosting 2 interactive workshops for SMEs which was hosted by PWC Legal. Employers lack of understanding of status documents was identified as the main barrier to Rights to Work Checks
- 5.2. Andrew Lawton of the Refugee Council reported back on behalf of the working group The LSMP working group which made recommendations on more sustainable ways to support small businesses with carrying out status checks.
- 5.3. Mike Wells responded for the Home Office. He welcomed the report and reiterated that preventing illegal working is an important but complex agenda involving many part of the organisation.

Action1: Mike Wells to pull together relevant Home Office colleagues to meet with the LSMP working group and discuss options in delivery of the recommendations

6. GLA/UKVI SME visa help pilot project: initial findings and recommendations

- 6.1 1Kirsten Mcfarlane from UKVI presented the initial findings of the evaluation of the three month pilot which was launched on 23 September 2013 on the GLA website. The webpage offered extra help for Small and Medium Businesses in navigating Home Office visa sponsorship processes. The pilot was extended by a further month and ended on 28 February 2014
- 6.2 Km summarised the findings
 - Characterisation and targeting of 'SMEs' proved difficult
 - Toolkit & Helpline received positively by users & stakeholders. However, the very low level of participation in the customer satisfaction surveys made measurement difficult.
 - A clear desire for simple access to UKVI information and contacts was identified
 - Much of this feedback supports wider change in UKVI

UKVI will extract those elements which point to further action or refinement of existing activities and develop a plan, subject to agreement with Ministers. The final evaluation will be circulated to members

7 Home Office Immigration Enforcement (HOIE) Sanctions and Intervention Unit

7.1 Ollie Carlisle, Interventions and Sanctions Directorate (I&SD), Immigration Enforcement, HO gave an overview of their work and pointed out that there are opportunities for working in partnership including Local Authorities, NHS, DVLA and Financial Services

8 Update on additional funding for English language training for jobseekers

8.1 Richard Bell, Skills Funding Agency provided an update on additional funding for English language training for jobseekers. It aims to improve the speaking & listening language skills to level 1&2. The training includes the cost of travel & child care

- 9.1 Simin Azimi reported back from MRAP meeting on 29 January 2014 including the positive presentation by Mike Wells, UKVI on engagement agenda
- 9.2 **MWE** informed members that UKVI has changed their website and invited members to feedback
