Further to the discussion of matter 2 at the examination hearing session on 15 January 2019, representatives for the Mayor advised that the individual assessments of the impacts of the Plan on people who share a “protected characteristic” as defined in the Equalities Act 2010 that were undertaken during the Integrated Impact Assessment could be published.

The Panel requests that those individual assessments, and any necessary supporting data, be submitted to the Examination Secretary for publication by **midday on Monday 21 January 2019**.

If anyone wishes to submit a supplementary written statement relating to matter 2 in response to this additional evidence it must be received by the Examination Secretary by **midday on Friday 15 February 2019**.

Matter 2 is:

Equality of Opportunity

M2. Does the *Integrated Impact Assessment* and Addendum Report (NLP/CD/04 & 05) indicate that the Plan will help to advance equality of opportunity between people who share a “protected characteristic” as defined in the *Equality Act 2010*¹ and those that do not share it and further the other two aims of the Act? In particular, which policies of the Plan will achieve this?

The Panel will have regard to any supplementary written statements received by that deadline in its consideration of matter 2.

Furthermore, the Panel will consider the additional evidence provided on behalf of the Mayor and advise in due course whether any further information or analysis is required in order to inform its consideration of the examination matters in the context of the public sector equalities duty.
