

**MAYOR'S OFFICE FOR POLICING AND CRIME (MOPAC)

MOPAC's accounts are subject to external audit by Mr Paul Grady, Director, Grant Thornton, 5th Floor, Grant Thornton House, Melton Street, Euston Square, London NW1 2EP. Members of the public and local government electors have certain rights in the audit process:

1. From **3 June to 14 July 2016 between 10am and 4pm** any person may inspect the accounts of MOPAC for the year ended 31 March 2016 and certain related documents (comprising books, deeds, contracts, bills, vouchers and receipts) at Empress State Building, Empress Approach, London SW6 1TR (ask for Joy Lincoln at the reception desk). They may also make copies of the accounts and documents. The accounts will also be available on the MOPAC website <https://www.london.gov.uk/what-we-do/mayors-office-policing-and-crime-mopac/about-mayors-office-policing-and-crime-mopac/our-0>
2. During the period 3 June to 14 July 2016 a local government elector for the area of MOPAC, or his/her representative, may ask the auditor questions about the accounts. Please contact the auditor at the address given above to make arrangements to ask any questions.
3. During the period 3 June to 14 July 2016 a local government elector for the area of MOPAC, or his/her representative, may object to MOPAC's accounts asking that the auditor issue a report in the public interest and/or apply to the court for a declaration that an item in the accounts is contrary to law (under section 28 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014). Written notice of a proposed objection and the grounds on which it is made must be sent to the auditor at the address given above and copied to me at the address given below.
