### 1. Terms of Reference

The drafted Terms of Reference were discussed by members and broadly agreed with some small amendments recommended by the board. It was agreed they would be redrafted before the next board for approval.

### 2. Membership

The Board members agreed to identify named deputies of sufficient decision-making authority in case of nonattendance. It was also discussed about inviting additional attendees to be present depending on the agenda to ensure specific topics could be covered most effectively.

### 3. Governance

The members discussed how this Board relates to and differentiates from other boards. It was agreed that arrangements should be reviewed regularly in order to have clarity about the different roles of the governance Boards to avoid duplication.

## 4. Victims' Reference Group

The board discussed that the Victims' Reference Group's (in development, to be chaired by Claire) work will impact on the Victims Board. A cross section of victims, from different crime types and demographics will be needed to make up panels at the VRG and ensure discussions are broad and representative.

#### 5. Victims' Summit

Claire Waxman thanked everyone for their participation and contributions towards the 2017 Summit and feedback from members about the event was positive. There was some brief

discussion about developing the next Summit including having a specific theme, or a 'victims week' to promote this.

## 6. Workplan

The Board looked at the actions from the Justice Matters session on victims from September 2017 to form the basis of the workplan for the Board. This includes, review of compliance with the Victims Code of Practice, Victim Personal Statements, trials and victims' compensation schemes. There was a discussion around VPS and the lack of communication about the fact that victims can be cross examined on the content of their personal statements in court as well as potentially have this published by media. It was also highlighted that victims are not aware whether their VPS was considered during sentencing.

#### Other workstreams

Online Victims' Portal – Claire updated the Board on progress. Claire Waxman described Deep Dive of rape cases that was being undertaken and the findings will be fed back to the board.

## 7. VCOP review

This Review looks at the full range of services provided to victims – by statutory and CJS agencies as determined by the Victims' Code and the provision of support services, primarily delivered by the VCSE sector. All members are supportive of this Review and will be kept up to date on progress.

## 8. Court Survey

There was an update that MOPAC and partners are developing a criminal justice court satisfaction survey. There was a request for members to identify key questions and any oversights.

## 9. Any Other Business

There was some discussion about the role of London Heads of Community Safety and the need to clarify their roles to ensure that they have insight into issues of ASB and intervention.
